SUBJECT: Minutes of the Fort Moore Garrison Community Leaders Information Forum

1. The Fort Moore Garrison Community Leaders Information Forum (CLIF) panel convened by MS Teams.

2. The CLIF panel and briefers provided valuable information to senior spouses and leaders to share with their units. Today's topic: Wellness.

3. Community Forum:

a. Directorate of Family and MWR – Ms. Lori M. Smith highlighted we have five fitness centers throughout post including Smith, Audie Murphy, Kefurt, Whittington and Santiago offering a variety of equipment for any interest. Two of the fitness centers offer 24/7 operation, Whittington and Smith. To access these facilities during 24/7 operations you must register at each facility separately. Registration does not transfer between the two. Aquatics include two indoor pools including Smith and Briant Wells, and two other pools that operate seasonally, Breezeway and Carey. Briant Wells and Carey pools are primarily our mission pools, serving things like combat water survival, drownproofing, and other training for Soldiers, but also offer lap swimming in the mornings. Smith and Breezeway are our recreational pools. We offer a Commander's Cup Sports Program which is for our active duty Soldiers only and includes basketball, softball, volleyball, soccer, and flag football. We also hold several 5K runs that are Family friendly throughout the year.

b. MACH's Department of Behavioral Health – SFC Derrik Polk stated they have active-duty access from 0730 to 1600 and Family member access 0730 to 1730 and emergency room 24/7. If you have Soldiers or Family members that need the care, they can always walk in.

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c. MACH's Clinical Dietetics Branch – 1LT Benjamin VerDow. The branch offers individual nutritional appointments with a variety of nutrition related topics, including weight management, diabetes, cholesterol, pediatric nutrition. They offer a bariatric program, performance classes for each month including weight management, and pregnancy classes. For appointment call 762-408-2273 or 726-408-1133.

d. MACH's Department of Women's Health and Newborn Care – SFC Brie Houston. They offer a non-stress test for active duty only, walk-in contraception clinic, labor and delivery unit, triage rooms, new parent support, breast feeding support group every Thursday 1000 - 1200 and Mother/Baby Unit. Located on the MACH's 5th floor.

e. Armed Forces Wellness Center – Mr. Douglas J. Terza, Director at the Armed Forces Wellness Center. They have locations across the globe and standardized Wellness and Prevention Program under the Defense Health Agency. They are pushing a new readiness assessment as we're branding it. The main thing is measuring cardiorespiratory fitness meant for everybody, both active duty and beneficiaries.

f. R2 Performance Center Fort Moore – Ms. Camille Watkins, Prevention, Resilience and Readiness. They have various curriculums to ensure they are focused on the right things at the right time, their ability to build one's confidence and performance, ability to manage energy effectively as well as ability to teach imagery. Located on Main Post in Building 975 between Abrams Hall and the Breezeway swimming pool.

4. Panel Updates:

a. Directorate of Emergency Services (DES) – MAJ Eddie Porter stated the Internet Crime Complaint Center was established in 2000 by FBI as the lead agency. If you think you or a Family member have been a target of Internet crime, report to the Internet Crime Complaint Center at <https://www.ic3.gov/>. Then you can still follow up with your local state or federal agency about crime that you've submitted.

b. MACH – Mr. Robert A. Holcek stated the hospital will be closed 15 January. Friday, 12 January, will be normal staffing, emergency services and our inpatient services, which are open every holiday. The emergency room is open 24/7 every day of the year.

c. The Villages at Fort Moore – Mr. Jason Maxfield invited everyone to join the free Active Building Resident Portal to ensure residents stay in touch with all things Villages. The Resident Responsibility Guide states remove decorations 15 days after the holiday. Pajama Movie Night at McGraw Village 26 January at 1800. (Indiana Jones Dial of Destiny).
